Let God Draw You Close this Lent!

James 8:7-10

"7 Therefore submit to God. Resist the devil and he will flee from you. 8 Draw near to God and He will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners; and purify your hearts, you double-minded."

Father Joseph Creedon, in Crossing the Desert, has this to say about Lent: It seems ...as if we are afraid of getting too close to God. Perhaps we are afraid of the goodness.

Maybe we think life is going to be dull if we draw too close. It could also be that we are afraid of giving up the illusion that we are in charge of our lives. Lent is all about letting ourselves be loved by God, to be reconciled with God. Since God in His goodness never stops loving us, never stops trying to draw close to us, and never abandons us, we are the ones who must change. Lent is daring to believe once again that we can let ourselves be drawn close to God, that the goodness of God will not overshadow us but empower us. God's goodness will enrich our lives and help us believe in what we can accomplish if we will just stop fighting Him.

For much of church history, Lent was a time to reflect on the believer's purpose in life, how they strayed from it, and the desire to draw closer to God towards wholeness and fulfillment. James says in order to draw close to God we need to cleanse our hands, and purify our hearts, which will keep us from being double minded. That's why the period of Lent is 40 days; it is 40 days of washing and purifying our lives. We give things up that take our time or focus away from drawing nearer to God. If we are giving up ice cream or chocolate or watching a favorite television program for Lent, going back to those things doesn't present much of a problem or leave our life transformed spiritually.


