

## From the Pastor

#### Crisis or Opportunity

#### 1 Chronicles 4:9-10

Jabez was more honorable than his brothers. His mother had named him Jabez, saying, "I gave birth to him in pain." Jabez cried out to the God of Israel, saying, "Oh that you would bless me indeed and enlarge my territory! Let your hand be with me, and keep me from the evil one." And God granted his request. (NIV)

The New Year, 2017, is here! One of our family traditions on New Year's Day is to eat sauerkraut and pork. The Pennsylvania Dutch proverb relates if you eat pork on New Year's Day, you'll root ahead. If you eat chicken you'll scratch backwards. If 2016 was a good year and you want to repeat it, you'd eat chicken. If it wasn't a good year you would eat pork hoping to move ahead, and the New Year will be better than the past. So we look back to what has been and reach forward to what is possible. Looking back includes both the positive as well as the negative things. To look forward to what can be or should be possible is also important. How was your 2016? How was Christ Church's 2016? My family always eats pork on New Year's Day but I'm not sure it's because the past year was that bad. Life is full of ups and downs, but no matter how good or bad it is, we want better things to happen. Jabez is only mentioned in these two verses of the bible. The first verse says his mother named him Jabez because she gave birth to him in pain. What mother has not given birth in pain? We all experience pain in one form or another. We all face pain or crises' throughout our lives. All people have experienced a bad day, a bad week or even a bad year. Jabez cried out to God in a prayer to bless him, help him in his work (increase his territory), be with him in all he did, and keep him from evil and harm. Jabez was asking God to take His rightful place in his life. God is the one who can take any crisis and turn it into opportunity, but only when He is in complete control of our lives or the life of the church.

If 2016 was not a good year for you, 2017 can be better and I don't think eating pork or chicken will really matter. What matters is God's rightful place in our personal lives and the life of the church. I pray that God will turn our crisis into opportunity and bless all of us in 2017.




The BASIC short film series, through Francis Chan's teaching, challenges us to reclaim the simple, full, and beautiful journey of the church that is described in Scripture.


