

Everything is cleaned up from the July yard sale. York Rescue picked up most of it and some was taken to Goodwill in Shrewsbury and some will be brought out again for the yard sale October 6, 7, & 8. Also, thanks to those that helped move and clean and clear out the Rishells house as they moved to Florida. It was a busy time for several days as we were also getting ready for the yard sale in July.

The backpack program for the Loganville Elementary School will begin this September. Our church will participate in this by providing meals for needy children for the weekends including 2 breakfasts, 2 lunches, 2 snacks per child and 1 hot meal per family for about 10 families in all. They are getting the shelves ready for us to begin to drop off what we are able to share. Thirty percent of Dallastown students live in poverty. I am hoping and praying that many of you will help to participate. Our food pantry, the library in Jacobus, and the Boy Scouts are all planning on helping.
All things are possible in Christ Jesus our Lord. I am also planning on including an invitation to worship with us in the backpacks if the school will allow.




